With a vision for the community that focused on Mind, Body and Spirit, the Paepckes helped Aspen begin a civic and cultural renaissance — one that continues to this day — we call it "The Aspen Idea." The Hotel Jerome was built by early Aspen supporter and visionary Jerome B. Wheeler and has been an Aspen landmark and local gathering place since its opening in 1889. An elegant hotel for most of its existence, the Jerome is also home to a number of restaurants, most notably the "J-Bar" where patrons can order the infamous "Aspen Crud," a milkshake infused with numerous liquors that was the preferred (and off-limits) drink of Tenth Mountain Division soldiers training here during WWII. The hotel, located in the heart of Aspen, is renowned for its overall relaxed elegance, with a unique blend of contemporary luxury and historic heritage.

Aspen local Neal Beidleman is a mountaineer, climbing guide and aerospace engineer. He is known for surviving the 1996 Mount Everest disaster and saving lives that day. He has conducted numerous public talks about his experiences in that disaster, especially in regard to decision-making

and team management. Beidleman's stories were also featured on the television news show Nightline. He made a return trip to Mount Everest in 2011. In the spring of 1996, Beidleman was working as a guide for expedition leader and friend Scott Fischer on Mount Everest. During the summit bids, a tragedy involved the death of Fischer and several other climbers. The book, Into Thin Air, is based on that fateful 1996 Mount Everest climb. 

HOW TO GET TO ASPEN

Airport Options and Driving Information Based on Selected Airport

Aspen/Pitkin County Airport (ASE) is located three miles from downtown Aspen, and is the most convenient airport in the Rocky Mountain region. United, American and Delta serve Aspen Airport. **Click here** to view the Summer/Fall schedule Aspen Flight Information.

There is also service into **Eagle County Regional Airport**, located 70 miles from Aspen. American and United Express fly nonstop from a number of U.S. cities into Eagle. Eagle County Regional Airport number: 970-328-2680. Eagle Airport has fewer flights than Aspen in the summer and all of the routes fly into Aspen as well. From Denver, Aspen is 220 miles or approximately 3.5 hours. Guests driving from **Denver International Airport** have two routes to choose from to get to Aspen. I-70 West to Glenwood Springs where you exit for State Highway 82 South to Aspen.

Another scenic route from Denver is I-70 West to State Highway 91 South through Leadville to US 24 South, then west onto State Highway 82 over Independence Pass which is the top of the Continental Divide. For more information on Independence Pass, **go here.**

Another airport option is **Grand Junction**, which is a two-hour drive from Aspen. Phoenix and Vegas are two cities with nonstops to Grand Junction. **http://www.gjairport.com/flight-info/32.html**

SHUTTLE OPTIONS

Hotel Jerome offers on-demand Aspen Airport transfers included in the resort fee. Guests should call the hotel at 970-920-1000 upon landing at Aspen Airport to request pick-up service. Aspen Airport is located 10 minutes from Hotel Jerome.





GONDOLA RIDE UP ASPEN MOUNTAIN AND WALK WITH A NATURALIST

Wednesday, August 2, 2017 Time: Depart hotel at 1:30pm; return at 4:30pm (Leadership Summit concludes at 12:30pm.)

Transportation: Guided walk from hotel to Aspen Gondola

Description: Explore the top of Aspen Mountain on Richmond Ridge on a guided tour with an Aspen Center for Environmental Studies (ACES) Naturalist. Wildflowers, wildlife, and mining history are just a few of the topics that will be shared as the walk winds through the forest to a 360-degree viewpoint. The trailhead elevation is 11,200 feet, with a high point of 11,300 feet for the duration of the one-mile hike. **Fee:** \$50 per person [\$7 of the fee will be donated to the DMA West Foundation to fund research projects]
