

HORSEBACK RIDING — BEAVER CREEK STABLES

Time: 2:30pm - 4:15pm (I-hour riding time)

Departure: Plan to arrive at the stables by 2:30pm for pre-ride check-in

Transportation: Walk from the Park Hyatt Beaver Creek to Beaver Creek Stables

Description: Beaver Creek Stables operates the best horseback riding stables in the Vail Valley, to provide you with one of the most exhilarating outdoor activities on your Colorado adventure. The stables are on Beaver Creek Mountain.

Fee: \$125 per person [\$5 of fee to be donated to DMA West Foundation]

Notes: Enclosed shoes are required, no sandals. Wear long pants and a hat if you are not wearing a helmet. Rain slickers without hoods are provided in the event of rain, which is frequent on afternoon rides. Bring any additional rain gear you wish, and a fleece jacket or a sweatshirt if needed. Bring a water bottle with you. Water and/or water bottles are for sale at the stables. A tote bag will be provided so you can carry your items. Leave any valuables or large bags at your hotel.

GUIDED VAIL PASS BIKE TOUR — VENTURE SPORTS

Time: 2:30pm - 5:30pm | 3 hours

Departure: 2:30pm from Park Hyatt Beaver Creek

Transportation: Picked up at Park Hyatt Beaver Creek and dropped at the top of Vail Pass, then picked up in Vail to transport back to the hotel

Description: Enjoy breathtaking views of the Gore Range and the Vail Valley. A guided, easy-to-moderate, 15-mile ride downhill, along a paved bike path that ends in the heart of the Vail Village at their Base Camp location. Fee includes your bike, helmet, water and gourmet snacks. Vail Pass Guided tours are led by first-aid/CPR-certified guides.

Fee: \$180 per person [\$5 of fee to be donated to DMA West Foundation]

Notes: Each bike will be outfitted based on a participant's height. Bring sunscreen, eye protection, closed-toe shoes, and a light jacket, depending on the forecast.

Minimum: No minimum; 15 participants maximum

GUIDED HIKING TOUR — BEAVER CREEK HIKING CENTER

Time: 2:00 pm - 5:00pm | 3 hours

Departure: Depart from and return to Park Hyatt Beaver Creek

Transportation: N/A – Trail begins near the base of the Centennial Lift (Chair 6) at Beaver Creek Village.

Description: For easy access to a tucked-away mountain lake, it's hard to beat the six-mile-round-trip hike to Beaver Lake, which starts at the ski area then continues beyond it. It's also a great hike for socializing, as much of it is on a wide (former wagon) trail where you don't have to walk single-file. Beaver Lake is ringed with conifers and sparkles under that blue, blue Colorado sky. Find a shady spot for a snack before heading back to civilization.

Fee: \$115 per person

[\$5 of fee to be donated to DMA West Foundation]

Notes: All guided hikes include water, granola bars and demo hiking gear, if needed. Bring your sunglasses, sunscreen and comfortable hiking attire/ shoes. Remember to drink plenty of water.

Minimum: 4-7 participants

JEEP TOUR — ABOVE & BEYOND

Time: I:30pm - 5:00pm | 3 hours

Departure: I:30pm departure from Park Hyatt Beaver Creek

Transportation: Above & Beyond to bring Jeeps to the Park Hyatt Beaver Creek; transportation provided

Description: Jeep tours near Vail are one of the best ways to enjoy the spectacular Rockies. See incredible mountain ranges surrounding the Vail Valley from the comfort of a customized Unlimited Jeep Wrangler. Along the way, you'll pass by fields of wildflowers, hear stories about the area's local history and possibly experience a chance encounter with local wildlife. Bring your camera (or your phone!) for fabulous picture-taking opportunities.

Fee: \$165 per person [\$5 of fee to be donated to DMA West Foundation]

Notes: Beverages and snacks are provided. Bring a light jacket, sunglasses, sunscreen, camera, hat and closed-toe shoes. Rain gear will be provided, weather dependent.

ZIPLINING - ZIP ADVENTURES

Time: 1:00pm - 5:00pm | 4 hours

Departure: I:oopm departure from Park Hyatt Beaver Creek to 4 Eagle Ranch, 4098 CO-131 in Wolcott, Colorado

Check-in and Safety Briefing: 1:30pm

Transportation: Transportation options to 4 Eagle Ranch to be determined based on final number of participants

Description: Just 20 minutes from Beaver Creek in Wolcott, Colorado. Soar through a scenic Vail Valley canyon with Zip Adventures – one of the top ten zip lines in the world! With six zip lines near Vail and Beaver Creek, each with their own personality and ready to show you wild and wonderful Colorado. After the safety briefing, there will be a IO-minute ride in a six-wheel off-road vehicle to enjoy six zip lines over the historic Alkali Creek Canyon.

Fee: \$255 per person

[\$5 of fee to be donated to DMA West Foundation]

Notes: These items are included: ziplining gear, helmet, safety briefing, snacks and water. Wear closedtoe shoes and comfortable clothing. Bring sunscreen and a hair tie if you have shoulder length or longer hair. Maximum weight is 250 lbs.

WHITEWATER RIVER RAFTING — SAGE OUTDOOR ADVENTURES

Time: 2:00pm - 5:30pm | 3.5 hours

Departure: 2:00pm from Park Hyatt Beaver Creek

Transportation: Transportation options to Vail Transportation Center to be determined based on final number of participants

Description: Vail's true local stretch of water. Raft through the heart of Vail Village! Surf waves and play holes are interspersed with fun rapids. Enjoy the breathtaking scenery of the Gore Range, waterfalls cascading off enormous granite cliffs, and some of Colorado's most spectacular Aspen tree groves. Enjoy Vail from a whole new perspective! It's a six-mile trip on the water.

Fee: \$205 per person

[\$5 of fee to be donated to DMA West Foundation]

Notes: Wear your swimsuit, bring a fleece jacket (if it's a cold day), dry clothes, towel, sunscreen, and sunglasses with croakies. Sage Outdoor Adventures will provide wetsuit, river booties, splash top, PFD and helmet. Release waivers will be provided to participants for signature prior to the rafting trip.
